



## Freeport Bahamas Duty Free Shopping on The Mall

Freeport, the second most familiar named area in the Bahamas, only has a population of around 40,000. Of course, that's not counting travelers. Many of the roads in Freeport still lead to nowhere. Some just end abruptly; others enter what might some day be a development. Even in the central district, the commercial area that houses the port-authority headquarters, banks and apartment complexes, the large colonial structures are still separated by significant stands of the native pine forests. The center district is easy to navigate through on foot; most of the residents live outside this area, in the suburbs. But THIS is where you come to shop!

Between Ranfurly Circus – named for a British royal governor in the 1950s who supported the city's development, and Churchill Square about ten blocks north is The Mall! The Mall is home to not only a straw market and assorted souvenir stands, it also is where the Duty Free shops are: The jewelry shops, perfume stores, resort wear, crystal, and also where you can buy rum and Cuban cigars.
