



## **Myrtle Beach, SC 60 Miles Long**

Myrtle Beach is considered the number one golf destination in the United States. Made possible with the felling of most pine trees in the area caused by the devastation caused by hurricane Hazel, the exposed land gave developers the opportunity to cover the now cleared land with golf courses. And when Myrtle Beach's warm-weather vacationers left as the temperatures dipped, Myrtle Beach was able to appeal to a different core of tourists that were looking for golfing destinations.

There are probably as many as 100 golf courses in the area, some of them of championship caliber and some that host PGA and LPGA events.
